COVID-19 catch-up premium spending: summary

SUMMARY INFORMATION

Total catch-up premium budget:	£10,967.45
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STRATEGY STATEMENT

During the Autumn Term, the school's catch-up priorities will initially focus on reading. Some of this will be managed within our original staffing as we have a trained Reading Support Teaching Assistant who will focus upon Year Two pupils, identified by their teachers and Senior Leaders during the Autumn Term Progress Tracking Meeting. Alongside this, small phonics groups will occur daily in Year Two with the emphasis being on readiness for the Phonics Screening Check in December. In addition to this, the Reading Support TA will be employed to focus upon the pupils during After School club, to support them with daily reading practice.

From the Spring Term onwards, a part-time teacher will be employed to work additional hours, with intervention groups and booster lessons for pupils identified within the January Progress Tracking Meetings, with a focus on either writing or maths, which will be dependent upon the outcomes of those meetings. It is likely that Year Two pupils will be prioritised first, with Year One and Foundation Stage pupils being identified later in the year.

Updated on 28/1/21: Due to the Lockdown in January 2021, this will be postponed until the children return to school. Children will be identified when the school fully re-opens.
